Welcome to the Third Annual Sandhills Red Select Production Sale. This introduction will sound a lot like last year. I have not changed the focus of my breeding program or my ideals because of some great new herd bull or a perceived market opportunity. My program could be classified as boring as I try to raise cattle that can do a little of everything pretty well.

My breeding program has stayed focused on all aspects of beef production from conception to consumption and includes female productivity, fertility and longevity. Our females are bred to have a moderate frame and high volume. The results of which are noticeable in the carcass ultrasound data that reflects 1.26 square inches of REA/CWT in the bulls we scanned this spring. This measurement mirrors the data from the 2011 bulls that average the same boring 1.26 inches. The genetics we are offering in this sale are predictable and dependable.

I hope you can attend our sale as all the breeders in this offering are dedicated to providing you with the best, most real cattle we can produce. We do not breed for the highest attainable EPD package and we do not subscribe to the bull of the month club promoted by so many breeders. I do not feed to attain big average daily gains or high yearling weights.

My focus will always be to raise reasonable-framed, forage-converting, high-fertility, low-maintenance, problem-free cattle, with a soft disposition. Not all of our cattle are there, which is why we are offering only the top end of our 2011 born bull calves. I am very confident that the bulls in this offering will do the things that are said they will do.

As you look through the catalog, you will find that my comments have not changed much from years past. Our program has not been altered and while everyone tries to predict what will change and modify accordingly like a pendulum swinging from side to side, I can assure you that my plan is to keep raising the same type and kind of cattle you see today, for years to come. Please stop by anytime. Lane and I would love to have you visit our place and show you our operation.

First of all, we want to take this opportunity to thank all of our past customers for their continued support and faith in our program. Without your loyalty and belief in us, we wouldn't be able to do what we love and we certainly don't take that for granted.

These introductions generally provide an opportunity for breeders to bestow great virtues to their prospective buyers in the way of superlatives, magnificence, superiority, and ultimately, hyperbole. I don't fault anyone for it. It's what competition in like markets entices one to do. One of the basic principles of marketing is to establish product differentiation in order to create perceived value that will outsell the competitor and capture more market share.

If current trends are any indication, then it seems safe to say that there is plenty of market share to be had in the Red Angus breed today. Red Angus influenced females continue to be priced at a premium in relation to their counterparts and early results from Red Angus bull sales have been excellent. With that being known, I don't feel the need to blow smoke. There's plenty of that to be found elsewhere in the beef industry.

Our focus is really pretty simple. We want to raise bulls that will make great cows. By great, I mean that they are sustainable with structural integrity, quiet dispositions and a body type that lends itself to efficiency, longevity and durability. They need to calve easy, wean a good calf and breed back year after year. This is a goal and a process and we won't get there over night. We aren't there yet, but this is the path that we have defined and we intend to walk it. Good cows will raise good calves and will do it longer with greater consistently.

The bulls and heifers that we are offering have subscribed to a complete herd health and vaccination program. Our bulls and heifers are developed. We don't aim to achieve extraordinary average daily gains while developing our cattle as we believe in adequate growth to maintain structure, durability and longevity. Our bulls are hard muscled with no excess cover, so you can see them for what they are. The bulls averaged about 2.75 lbs. of gain per head per day and the heifers were allowed to develop on a high roughage diet with some Wet Distiller's Grains which will allow them to easily adapt to your environment. We aren't chasing extremes. We are trying to build consistency in type, kind and structural integrity.

Thank you again for the opportunity to provide you with your genetics. We look forward to visiting with you on sale day. Visitors are welcome to stop by anytime.

Welcome to the third annual Sandhills Red Select Genetic Opportunity Sale. We are pleased to be providing our 2-year-old bulls in this sale. Thank you for your interest in our cattle program and the opportunity to be your seedstock supplier. If we've done our job and the bulls do theirs, we hope to see you return in the future.

Choat Cattle Company was formally established in 2003 when we purchased our first registered Red Angus breeding stock. Although the official organization was formed in the recent past, we've been raising cattle since 1988. That first group of 20 Hereford cows and a Charlois bull were replaced with Black Angus cattle that were then replaced by a sizeable herd of Red Angus cattle. We have brought in genetics from many different herds throughout the Midwest. Our goal has been to develop cows that are functional, fertile, with good disposition. We are in the process of continuous improvement with this goal in mind. We believe you will see this effort reflected in the bulls on this sale

Our annual program consists of calving the majority of our calves in late April and early May in our calving pastures near St. Edward, NE. Once the calves have been vaccinated, most of the pairs are sent west to the Sandhills. When grass season ends in the fall, the cows and calves are brought back home to be weaned. The cows immediately go into the harvested cornstalks where they will stay until they begin calving. The calves go in to the yards and consume a high-roughage diet of alfalfa hay, corn silage and cracked corn. As the calves grow through the winter, we continually watch and evaluate their development. By March, we will have selected the bull calves that we will keep for this sale. As soon as the grass greens up, these yearling bulls head back out to pasture for the summer. As the fields are harvested in the fall, the bulls rough the winter in the stalks until late December. We then bring them back into the yards and begin selecting and preparing for this sale.

You'll find that we have not "pushed" these bulls to achieve incredible average daily weight gain. They are hard, not fat. They have been fertility tested and examined. All of them have a quiet disposition and are extremely easy to work with. They are in the right condition to leave this sale and go to work on your heifers or your cows in a few short weeks or months. Because our bull program is based upon a philosophy of slow development, we believe the very best bulls have been selected for this sale and they will work for you for several years.

Thank you for your continued interest in our cattle. Do not hesitate to call with any questions. We look forward to seeing you on sale day.

As another bull sale approaches, I take a look back at the previous year and say it was the best yet! Jilleen completed her odyssey to become a RN and we got her back to doing what she loves to do. Ryan, Claire, and Colin keep us all busy with 4H, football, baseball/softball, basketball on top of all the regular activities that are required of a 6th a 3rd and a kindergartner. With ranching, coaching and sneaking in a goose hunt whenever possible, I seem to stay busy.

Cooksley Red Angus was started in 1989 by Stuart and Cynthia Cooksley with the purchase of 40 heifers from Jerry Teahon and a Coppertop Chief 301 son from Ole Redland. We started this herd with one goal in mind, raising Sandhills adapted Red Angus bulls for our own use. Currently we are using several 5L Blazin Ram sons as they are moderate and easy fleshing. Our breeding program is focused on disposition, calving ease, low maintence, growth, and eye appeal.

Our cows calve in August after our commercial cows are done. The cows are wintered through on minimum inputs. Calves are weaned in March. These calves are fed 3 lbs. distillers and hay until May. They forage on range until December at which time they are fed DDG, oats, corn and hay. The meadows that they winter on offer plenty of room to rough house and exercise. The bulls are hard and ready to cover the miles and the cows.

Our large commercial herd allows us to use a large number of our own bulls per year. We usually use a lot of bulls from new herd sires before they are offered for sale in any numbers. This allows us to be fairly sure of what we are offering. We don't have a lot of new hot sires, but what we have are good proven lines.

To our customers, past and present, thank you for your trust and we hope to serve you to your satisfaction. If you are new customers, come and look around as I believe on the Sandhills Red Select Sale you can find everything that is good about the Red Angus breed. I think there a bull here no matter what your criteria are. Call or stop by for a visit anytime.

Bruns Red Angus is located in northeast Nebraska near Bloomfield. The ranch is operated by Kelly and Cindy Bruns along with children Cole and Kate. Grandpa Bruns lends a hand pretty much daily, if not helping work cattle or opening a gate, maybe just an ear to bounce ideas off of over a cup of coffee on a cold winter day. Thanks, Dad.

Our cows run on improved pastures and some native pastures in the summer and crop residue in the winter. What a wonderful winter it has been to utilize crop residue. There are a lot of calories out there when the cows can get to them. We expect our cows to work for us, therefore we prefer moderate framed – easy fleshing mommas that adapt to the environment. We have no place for big – hard doing cows in our world. The price of pasture these days won't allow for this. We also select for maternal traits and disposition. Calving season starts April 1st and is just about as good (but not quite) as Christmas to our kids. "Let's go tag calves" are the kids' favorite words and what a joy it is to have a group of cows that we can trust our kids with. Good disposition is a must!

Our calves are weaned on pasture across the fence from their mommas. For those of you who haven't tried this, I would encourage you to do so. What a stress free way of weaning. The bulls are then brought in and fed a diet of distillers, corn and grass hay. They are not pushed as hard as a lot of the industry pushes their bulls. Therefore they won't be as big at sale time, partially because of feed and partially because of age. However we feel these bulls will last longer and breed more cows. With the price of bulls today, one extra year out of a bull is a huge savings.

The youngest half of our bulls are kept home and run on pasture in the summer and then fed grass hay, distillers and corn until sale time the next year. They are sold as coming 2-year-old bulls. These bulls were bred and raised specifically for this purpose. Our coming two year old bulls have never seen a sale ring before and are not leftovers from the year before.

We welcome you to visit anytime and look forward to meeting you at the sale. We truly believe this sale is full of bulls that are the "ranchers kind."

Information about Osteopetrosis

Osteopetrosis, also known as Marble Bone, is a genetic defect that causes abnormalities to the development of the bone marrow cavity and brain, ultimately causing death.

Osteopetrosis has been reported in Hereford, Simmental, Red & Black Angus, and Holstein.

The inheritance pattern of Osteopetrosis is typical of most bovine genetic defects, in that it is homozygous recessive – meaning both parents must transmit one Osteopetrosis affected gene to the offspring in order for Osteopetrosis to be expressed. The inheritance pattern and probability of phenotypic expression of Osteopetrosis is identical to red/black hide color.

There is a 25% possibility that if two recessive carrier animals are mated that the recessive gene will express itself and result in a carrier animal and in turn, a dead calf. All of the known pedigree carriers in this sale have been tested in accordance with the guidelines set forth by the Red Angus Association of America. A carrier will transmit the OS gene to its progeny 50% of the time. Animals that are tested as carriers of the recessive gene are identified with the OSC label.

- **CED......** Calving Ease Direct predicts the probability of calves being born unassisted out of 2-year-old heifers.
- **BW......** Birth Weight predicts the difference, in pounds, for birth weight, and is also used in the calculation of Red Angus' Calving Ease Direct (CED) EPD.
- **WW......** Weaning Weight predicts the difference, in pounds, for weaning weight (adjusted to age of dam and a standard 205 days of age).
- **YW...... Yearling Weight** predicts the expected difference, in pounds, for yearling weight (adjusted to a standard 365 days of age).
- **Milk** *Milk* predicts the difference in maternal production of an individual animal's daughters as expressed by the weaning weight of their calves.
